








HEALTH CHANGE MODEL

Basilan Assistance Program (BAP)

Coverage

- Province level
- 10 of 13 component LGUs which account for 87.62% contribution to improvement in the over-all provincial accomplishments

Outcomes Target: Basilan province has improved nutrition outcome indicators (stunting, wasting, NAR, LBW, OPT coverage)

behavior change intervention, information system and food security models for local health and nutrition systems in the context of province-wide UHC capacity



Basilan Baseline Roadmap (2021)




Wasting Prevalence Rate among 0-5 Year Old Children








Key Learnings

- Localized governance is central to realizing the Nurturing Care Framework:
 - Provincial and municipal governments have led capacity strengthening, committee formation, budgeting, and coordination across sectors.
 - Investment in health-nutrition-safety yielded measurable results, proving the value of equitydriven, localized planning.
- Adaptive, systems-based approaches, anchored in strong local leadership, inclusive governance, and sustained community engagement can lead to measurable improvements in health and nutrition outcomes, even in fragile and conflict-affected settings
- Improved nutritional status in the first 1,000 days supports optimal brain development, emotional regulation, and physical well-being, laying the groundwork for school readiness and lifelong learning
