

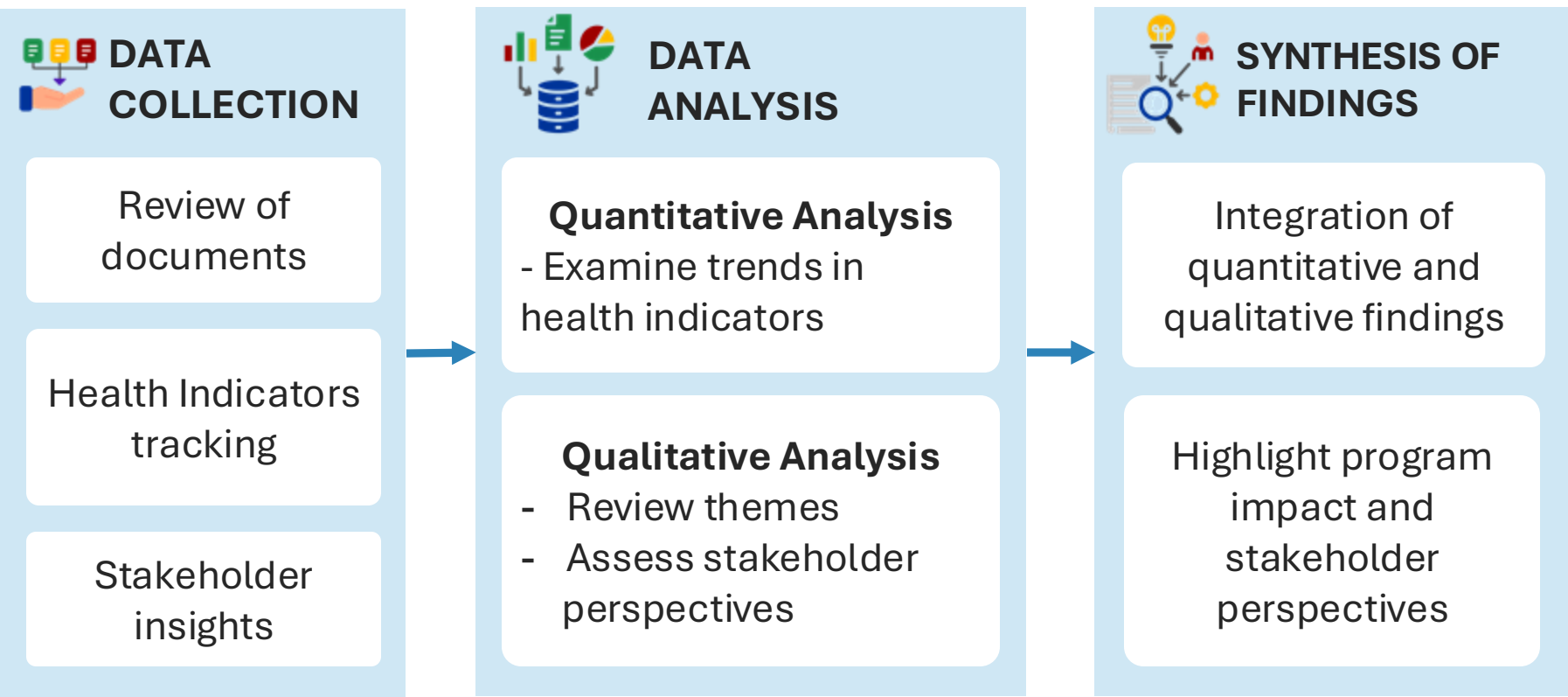


INTRODUCTION



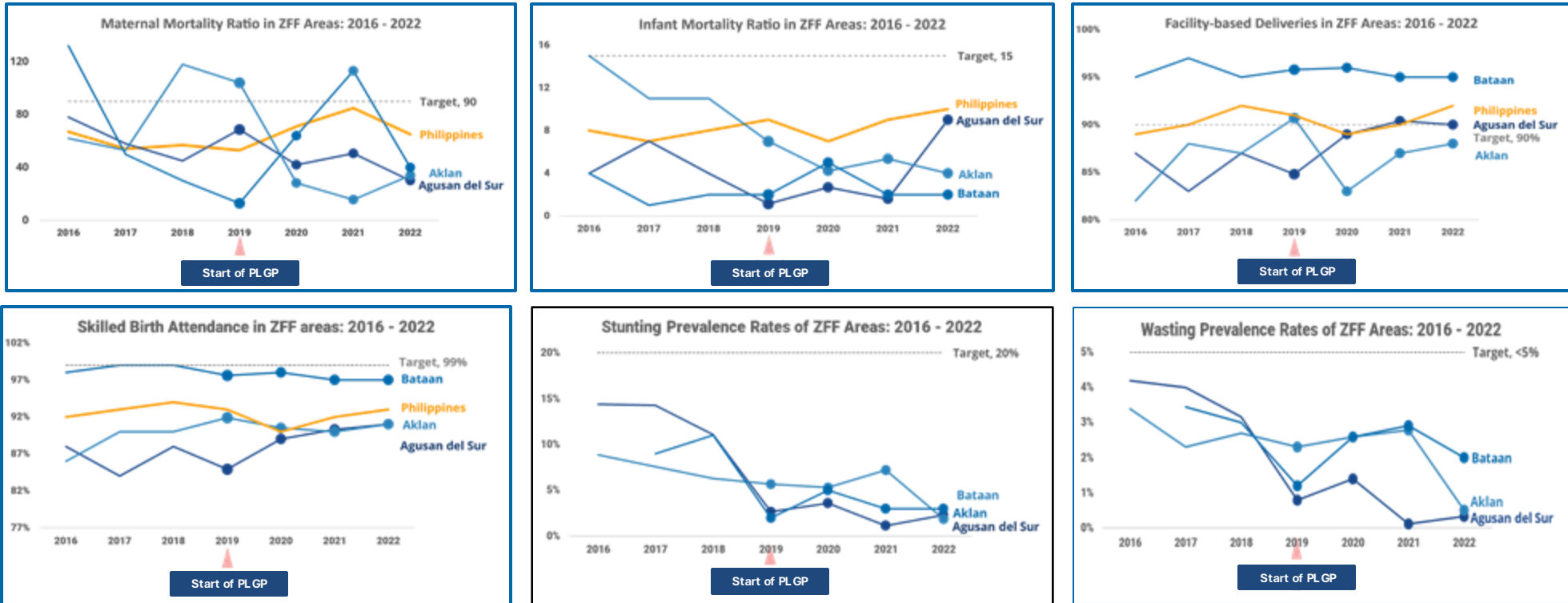
Sustainable Development Goal 17.17 is explicit on the importance of public-private and civil society partnerships and collaborations within and between countries for sustainable development and for achieving Universal Health Coverage. Over the past 30 years, public-private collaborations increased to achieve universal health coverage (UHC) and global health goals. From 2019 to 2022, the Zuellig Family Foundation implemented the Provincial Leadership and Governance Program Cycle 3 (PLGP-3) to improve local health governance in the context of decentralization. The program included training, mentoring, coaching and technical support for local health leaders. This paper aimed to provide a **comprehensive documentation of the design and implementation** of the recently concluded PLGP-3, **track the health outcomes** of its participating provinces, and **explore perceptions of different stakeholders** of the program.
